



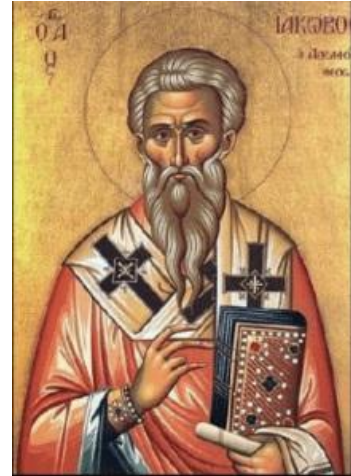
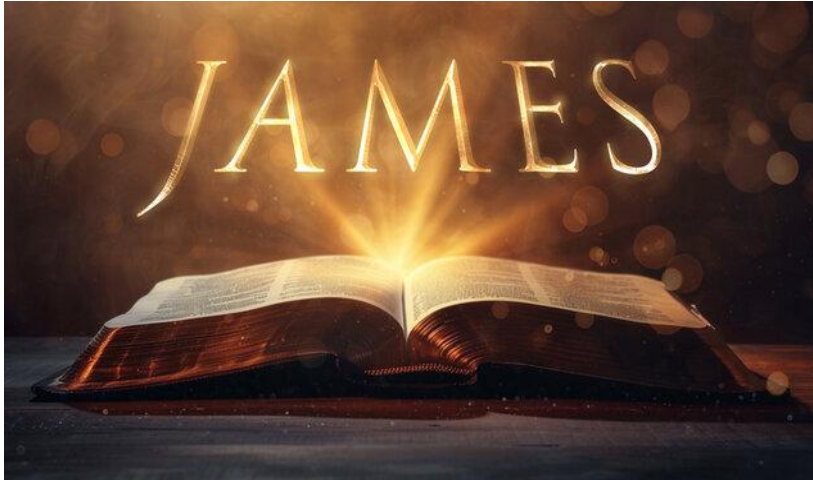

James reminds believers that God is in control and that He delights to give good gifts to those who seek them. He encourages believers to rely on God's wisdom and guidance.

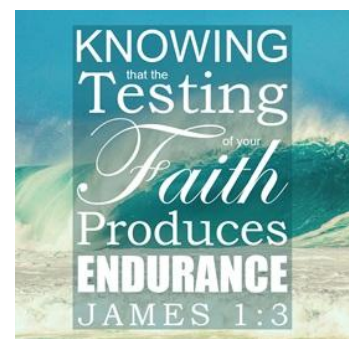
Synopsis

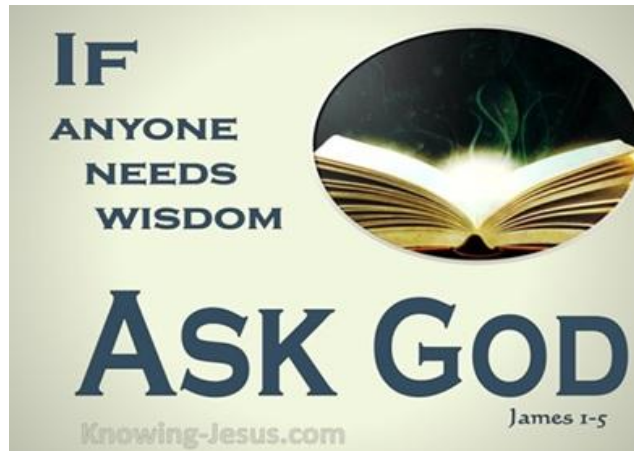

Here are ten verses that all of us should remember as we go through life:

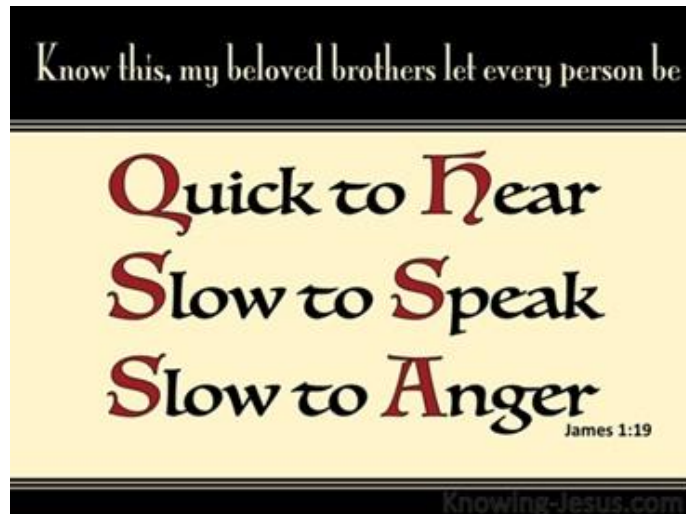
1:2-3 Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance.



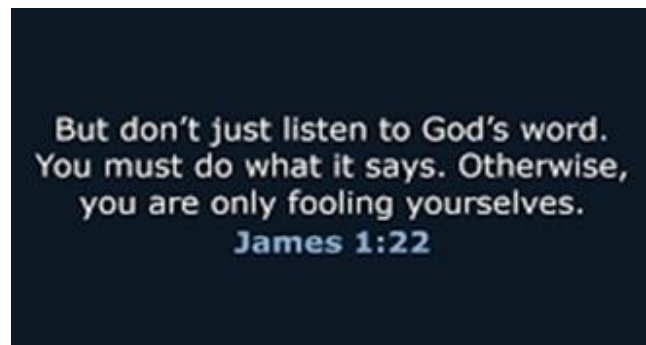
1:5-6 If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind.



1:19 My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: **Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry.**



1:22-24 **Do not merely listen to the word and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says!** Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror and after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like.



2:14-17 What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, **faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.**



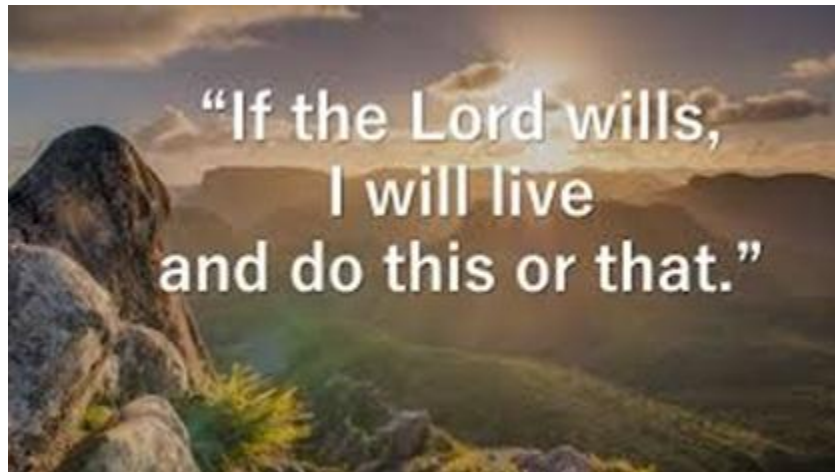

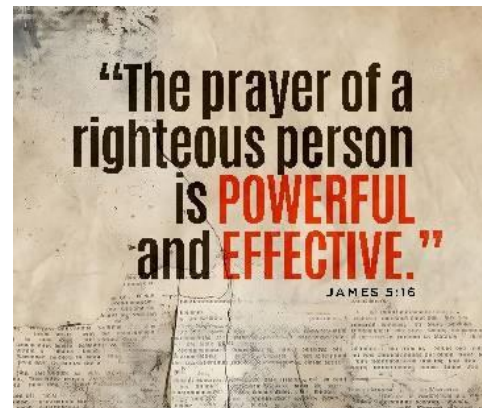
4:7-8 Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Come near to God and he will come near to you.



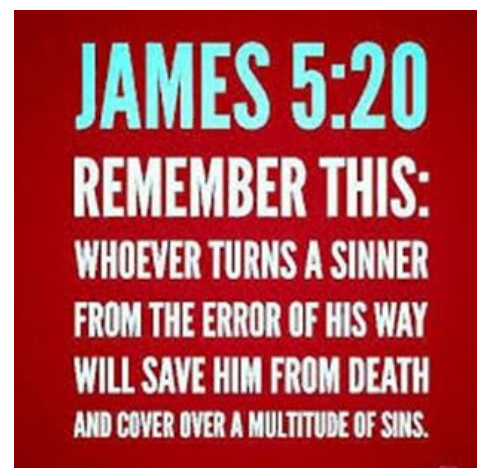

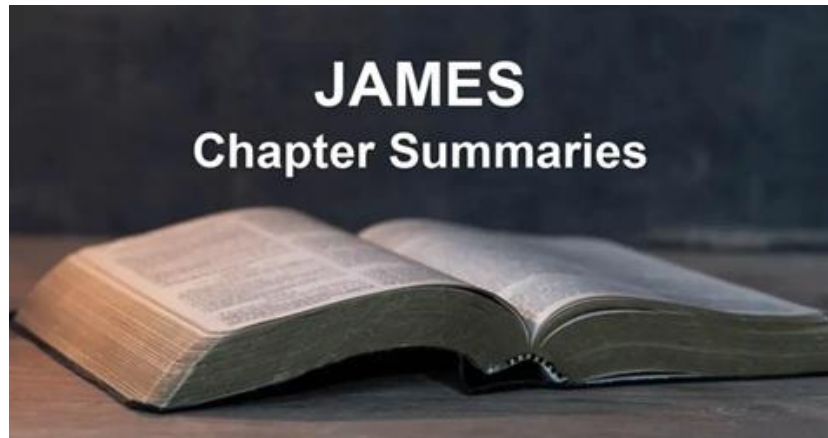


5:16 Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.
